DIRECTIONS & PARKING

Sudbury is approximately 40 minutes from the A120, A12 and A14 and about 90 minutes from London. Using the venue postcode of **CO10 2AN** will bring Satnavs to Quay Lane. If you continue down Quay Lane, past the Cricket pitch on your right and the Tennis Club on your left, you will find the Quay at the end of the lane.

Sudbury has a railway station with hourly services to Marks Tey, which meets the mainline to Norwich heading north, and London Liverpool Street heading west.

There is **free car parking for patrons** directly outside the theatre. This is managed by Creative Car Park Ltd. **Check your car in upon arrival** at the theatre using the QR codes displayed around the building or use the tablet at the Box Office. **Failure to do so will result in a fine issued by Creative Car Park Ltd. with whom any issues should be raised.**
