The Parade, Watford Town Centre

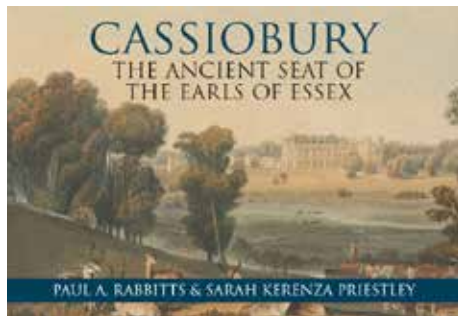
