Under the musical direction of **Hugh Beckwith**, the choir performs a wide-ranging repertoire of well known popular and classical songs.

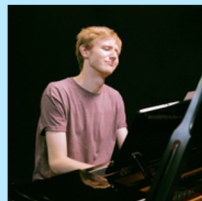


Hugh Beckwith - Musical Director
